

Marietta Minotos was born in Athens (Greece) on August 4, 1964. She studied Political Sciences in the University of Athens, where she did her doctoral thesis titled “*The European choice of the Konstantinos G. Karamanlis administration, 1957-1959*”. (degree: excellent).

She is a lecturer in the Department of Archival and Library Sciences at the Ionian University, where she teaches since 2002. The period 1989-2008, she was the Head of the Historical Archive of the Konstantinos G. Karamanlis Foundation. She was also Head of the three projects of Digitization of the Karamanlis Historical Archive, which formed part of the “Information Society” Business Program, co-funded by the European Union and the Greek State, and lasting from July 2004 to December 2008. She taught also to the postgraduate studies of others Universities in Greece (Department of History- Ionian University, Harokopion, etc) and abroad (University of Complutense, Madrid, etc).

She is member of several scientific bodies in Greece and in international level.

From 2004 until 2008 she served as Vice-President of the International Committee of Archivists and Archives of Parliaments and Political Parties (SPP), which operates in the context of the International Council on Archives (ICA). During the scientific works of the XIVth Congress of the ICA Congress held in Kuala Lumpur on July 2008 the Plenary Session elected her as President of SPP for the term 2008-2012.
